THIS TOOLKIT IS PREPARED WITH THE PURPOSE OF GIVING AN OVERVIEW OF THE TRAINING COURSE "YOUNG AND CREATIVE" AND GIVING THE LEARNING INSTRUMENT TO YOUTH WORKERS IN THEIR WORK WITH YOUTH.

THE TRAINING COURSE TOOK PLACE IN BERLIN, GERMANY FROM 5-14 DECEMBER 2022. AND BROUGHT TOGETHER PARTICIPANTS FROM 6 DIFFERENT COUNTRIES, GERMANY, ESTONIA, LATVIA, SERBIA, ROMANIA, AND TURKEY. THE PROJECT HAS BEEN SUPPORTED BY EUROPEAN COMMISSION ERASMUS+ PROGRAMME.

THE MAIN AIM OF THE PROJECT "YOUNG AND CREATIVE" IS TO DEVELOP, THE CREATIVE AND THE INNOVATIVE POTENTIAL OF 42 YOUTH WORKERS THROUGH ONE TRAINING COURSE USING NON-FORMAL EDUCATIONAL METHODS WHO WILL SHARE THEIR NEWLY ACQUIRED KNOWHOW WITH OTHER 50 LOCAL YOUTH WORKERS THROUGH NEW CURRICULA ON CREATIVITY AND DESIGN THINKING AND 1 E-LEARNING INSTRUMENT- A TOOLKIT ABOUT CREATIVITY.

THE FIRST PART OF THE BROCHURE CONSISTS OF THE ARTICLES CREATED BY PARTICIPANTS AND GIVES THEIR POINTS OF VIEW AND THEIR EXPERIENCE IN YOUTH WORK.

THE SECOND PART CONSISTS OF 7 WORKSHOPS DEVELOPED BY THE PARTICIPANTS DURING THE PROJECT WITH THE PURPOSE OF HELPING YOUTH WORKERS IN THEIR WORK WITH YOUTH.





In any country in Europe, there are always enthusiastic young people and youth workers who are ready to take an active and active part in activities to support the youth movement, even in conditions of lack of necessary resources.

It is possible to ensure that youth work has a long-term and widespread impact on the lives of young men and women throughout Europe only if these efforts are continuous, their importance is universally recognized and the necessary resources are provided to participants.

Work with young people can be carried out at any level, in any space or dialog environment, including in the form of virtual or direct interaction. Such work can be a one-time event or a program of regular events in which young people can interact with each other. In the process of this work, young people and youth workers develop together due to the fact that, for example, they learn to resist prejudice, solve personal, social and social problems and in practice be guided by the principles of democracy.

Voluntary participation is one of the key characteristics of working with young people. It is also important that this work does not allow condemnation or evaluation. Youth workers and young people themselves act on an equal footing, building, developing and maintaining these relations by joint efforts. Participation in such work gives young people the opportunity not only to gain independence, take responsibility for their actions and independently manage their own lives, but also to show civic activism, questioning and challenging established norms in order to eventually achieve positive social and political transformations.

From a practical point of view, working with young people is the route that groups of young people who are ready for change and development choose for themselves.

The development and quality assurance of work with young people is becoming increasingly important in all European countries. Approaches to quality assurance mechanisms, systems and tools vary widely - from national quality marks and professional standards to licensing of educational service providers and evaluation of youth organizations or youth workers.



Youth work is aimed at all young people between the ages of 6 and 27. It includes youth association work, open child work, and open youth work as well as community-oriented programmes. The focus of youth work is on political and social education, participation, sports-oriented, media-related, intercultural and gender-reflective youth work, cultural, natural history and technical education as well as international youth work.

Due to the voluntary and open character of the youth work, the offers are based on the interests and the living environment of the young people. They promote social responsibility and encourage social commitment.

Volunteering is similar to work like this, and I have had this fever for four years. Volunteering and this work help to develop the self, the expression of desires and the development of personal passions.

Why is youth work important for the community? Youth work is key to giving young people the space, support and confidence to have their voices heard on issues that matter to them and also to provide volunteering and social action opportunities.





Youth organizations provide a safe space for young people to learn the many skills necessary for adult life. Without the support of youth workers, it is difficult for young people to reach their full potential which can result in a great loss to the young people themselves and ultimately to society.

With life becoming more and more difficult for young parents, going through many economic hardships, sometimes they just do not have enough time for their children who are often left to their own devices. Youth is an undeniably valuable part of every community, having fresh ideas, the ability to come up with original solutions to modern problems, and knowledge of the newest technologies to innovate upon them. Despite that, most young people don't have the motivation or opportunity to contribute to their local communities, and because of that it is really important for youth workers to find new and interesting ways to attract them, as well as to give them a chance to start actualizing themselves in a familiar environment.

The more we include young people in participation in innovations and inventions for fields such as education, arts, sciences, etc., the better our communities will become, at least I believe that to be the case, and because of that youth work becomes vital for today's society. Many young people can be quite ambitious if given the right idea, direction and opportunity to try something new, so it is crucial for youth workers to understand who they are working with and find the much needed approach, one that many formal institutions lack.



From my personal experience of working closely with youth workers as well as being one of the younger generation myself, I can claim that the right balance between free space and restriction is needed to get the most value out of any workshop. Young people need enough freedom to express themselves, the right environment to not be embarrassed and just enough of the push to get them started and paint a clear and understandable frame of work.

For example of youth work in my own hometown I can provide our city's selfpeople government of young (Jūrmalas Jauniešu dome). Even though it has its flaws like any such organization, it has brought forth many good improvements for the local community, while also being accessible to all. One of such improvements has been a newly built youth center with a kitchen, quiet rooms, working computer rooms, game zones and also sound record rooms. Being organized and operated by the members of youths selfgovernance, it has its way to voluntarily attract young people to come with their friends, find new people, work on new projects and organize various events for entertainment or educational purposes.



That said, being a successful youth worker means invaluable benefits to your local community, because active and ambitious young people are very likely to approach any issue or interest with passion, so if workers are able to spark that in them, then it will surely bring any progress forward.

Youth work is important for teenagers because they can accumulate a lot of information and they can learn how to communicate with other people and express their ideas.

First of all, teamwork it's important for the new generation because they can develop a lot of skills like, how to communicate their ideas, how to express themselves, how to work with more than 2 people and the most important thing, they can learn life lessons from other, and not to repeat mistakes that other people do. A good example to be better understood it's the program Erasmus because this program it's based on the personal development of young people in other countries. Here, you need to communicate with everyone and you can learn something new every day because it's a diversity of cultures and mindsets and maybe life lessons.

Second of all, working with teenagers from the local community it's important for them because they can create really good friendships and they learn how to accept each other. But we have already talked about these things above. Teamwork in your local community can help it, like making the place famous for your work and making people come on these kinds of projects to see and learn some good things. About that, I like to think that my city can be a good example. So, Focșani, it's a little city and it's not that famous, but a few teachers from my town organise a project called "Boovie". The "Boovie" project is based on reading books, and then young people create trailers based on the books studied.

In conclusion, youth work is important for the local community and for the town, but

most importantly for the teenagers.

Finally, as a youth worker you are also responsible to present your local community to other communities to benefit them and get attraction.



In Romania youth work has some legal priorities, such as: prioritizing the child's best interest, respecting the child's dignity, listening to the child's opinion and others like it (for 13 to 18 years old, in the 272/2004 law), as well as ensuring the participation of young people in the decisions that concern them and increasing the degree of participation of young people in public life to encourage them to assume individual or group responsibilities (for those who has more than 18 years old, in 350/2006 law).

Another priority in working with young people in Romania is the promotion of strategies based on the results of current social research. For instance, researchers and popular media use the mid-to-late 1990s as starting birth years and the early 2010s as ending birth years for the zoomers. The negative effects of screen time are most pronounced in adolescents compared to younger children. That is why most of the activities in youth work should be interactive so that the community may benefit from the social skills that are acquired only through social activities. For this purpose, several volunteer programs for young people have been developed in our hometown and some of these volunteer programs were initiated from the very beginning by young students themselves (an example being "Green at the theater").

As a school counselor, I collaborated with the Youth Center in our town to run projects where older volunteers helped younger children and youth with various activities (such as "Volunteering seen up close").

But why is all of that important in our community?

When young people participate and get involved in organizing local community activities they become more responsible and less passive or actively dissatisfied with the already existing realities and they become more proactive, which is the main purpose of all forms of education.

If we add the Erasmus programs as examples of important youth work in our local community, we hope that the traditional way and the modern way of behaving (which are both included) can smooth the path to the new solution of the modern world by keeping in mind what was the resilient way of doing things in our past.

All school counselors in Romania work in schools, but are coordinated by CJRAE (County Center for Educational Resources and Assistance). In CJRAE we have many Erasmus programs and I took part in C.R.E.S.C. in Vrancea for the reintegration of immigrants. This program is very useful for creating a friendly atmosphere, for reducing cultural stereotypes and for supporting immigrants or migrants that came to our country.



Youth work is important for the community and for the individual. It provides a chance to learn new skills, make a contribution and gain experience that can be used in a career later on. There are many different types of youth work, including: volunteering, mentoring, teaching and coaching. Youth work can happen in an organized way, such as through an NGO or school program, international youth exchanges(short term or long term), training courses on an individual basis through informal relationships with young adults.

Perhaps the best idea would be bringing up together students and organizing seminars/conferences with the main focus on the value of education. And by doing so hopefully to inspire and be a great example for the upcoming generations as well.

Youth work is important for the local community due to the fact that the identity starts to shape around the ages of 12-20. Raising awareness in young people about various topics and involving them in activities about these topics will give them a sense of competence in their society.

The workshops or activities for young people may include a huge variety of issues. Youth work doesn't only have an effect on young people, but it also has an effect on adults. The young people who received non-formal education by youth work will be able to change their environment in many aspects as mentioned above. Meanwhile the adults in their the environment will be affected by the changes that young people are implementing. Many adults appreciate the young people and their improvement by trying to develop their society. In most societies it can even become a mentorship between professional adults and young adults. In addition, non governmental organizations appreciate competent young people who would like to engage in activities voluntarily and give an effort to expand the awareness about various topics in local communities. Young people become able to work with NGOs and have a chance to expand their effect on various problems in the world we all live in. For instance, in terms of my experience, after I participated in various different youth exchange projects I became more aware about social inclusion and the problems that migrants, immigrants and refugees face. I started to merge my knowledge about the topic I gained from projects and my field which is psychology and I created a business idea in another youth exchange which involved building our own business idea. I established networks with young people from other countries and we decided to make this idea real in future steps. My idea became a based, strong and applicable idea, in addition it became intercultural by my networks during youth exchange.

In my point of view, youth work is a step for local communities to grow bigger, become international and improve the world we all live in.





Youthworks play an important role in local communities in different ways. Firstly, the improvement of the local people depends mostly on the perspective of the youths. Young people should be able to speak freely in any environment where their views are taken and their participation is expected, and should not hesitate to speak. However, young people may be shy about participation, they may also have hesitations about taking their opinions into account and they may have distrust of politicians.

However, in environments where participation is ensured, young people should not face condemnation for the ideas they put forward. Otherwise, young people may be pushed into a shy position in terms of participation. If they can freely express their thoughts in such a free environment, it is very useful for local community.



Working with young people is very important because these are the people who have the future. The younger generation should understand how the world works and for this, it is necessary to contact them.

For example, you can be a member of any community, for example, USU student self-government, which is in schools. USU is a group of students who organize events at the school themselves, as well as decorate it for the holidays and come up with something new. This gives them the opportunity to feel like adults and independent. Local deputies also organize meetings with students wanting to know their opinion about something and tell how others see it. This is a very good practice, because this is how young people become closer to understanding what is happening in their city, country, and world.

Some organizations involve students in work, thereby showing that human work is important and it is also important to take care of what surrounds us. All this, as it were, instructs and directs them to do the right things. So it turns out that communication with young people is very important.



"Alternative reality"

Particular attention is paid to young people with fewer opportunities. The main mission of the organization - is a versatile development of personality, supporting young people and giving them opportunities for self-development, which contributes to the expansion of their horizons, the development of a sense of responsibility and understanding of the general objectives for the development of society.

The organization promotes a holistic approach, focusing on both the physical and spiritual development of the individual.



It mainly works by involving young people through creative methods and activities.

Here is a list of what the organization provides:

- school of fencing and self-defense
- debating youth clubs
- summer camps for children and teenagers
- youth fire theater
- Erasmus projects and volunteer projects.
- organization of social projects, annual multicultural festivals and long-term projects for the integration of children from orphanages.

For both Erasmus+ and the European Solidarity Corps, this organization received accreditation until 2027. In 2021, it also received an award from the Latvian National Agency for Human Rights. Alternative reality has been part of the Eurodesk platform since 2022, and regularly tell young people about opportunities to participate in various programs and projects.

Judging by my experience and contribution to this organization, so far I have only helped to organize local festivities for the project participants, and in a couple of weeks I have already got involved in the life of this organization.

Most often these were cultural evenings, where in different activities (for example - sword fights, dance battles, etc.) I was creating the vibe of particular events.

I plan to continue to invest my experience and time into Alternative reality and help it to grow bigger, so that at least within Riga, Latvian teenagers would have a place where they can spend time and develop.

"A HERO"

Working with young people and involving them in the local community is very important and local communities must become a priority.

The importance of a young person and the contribution they can make to their local community is huge, they can use their creative imagination, lateral thinking, and skills to make positive changes in their lives and have a positive impact on the lives of others.

The young people of the Allons-y Association participate in a non-formal education program based on volunteering, entitled "Un HERO", a personal development program that aims to increase self-confidence and acquire integrity as a principle of life, stop emigration to more developed countries of the European Union and finding meaning in life.

Increasing self-esteem and self-confidence, cultivating a sense of friendship and solidarity, understanding the importance of collaboration, and personal development as active citizens by stimulating civic participation are some visible results of the project.

The young people do volunteer activities for the "Red Cross" Vrancea organization, they organize blood donation campaigns, visit and entertainment campaigns of Elderly Care Centers, where they present plays. During the Christmas holidays, young people make hand-made decorations and with the money collected buy supplies and gifts for vulnerable children, who come from disadvantaged families. Also, during the school year, they become monitors and help disadvantaged children with their homework.

Each young person keeps a journal that contains principles, real-life stories, and introspective exercises that they complete. It is a tool that leads to personal development, an educational tool that builds character through practical application.



Youth work supports education recovery

Because of the influence of strong role models, young people who have access to trustworthy adults are more ambitious with their educational expectations and goals. Providing young people with outdoor learning experiences increases their motivation to pursue an education. For this reason, youth work puts efforts to provide access to nature for kids and teenagers from underprivileged homes. Youth workers generally have a different dynamic than teachers in their interactions with young people because of the voluntary engagement and participation that a youth work approach enables.

Youth work boosts youth employment

Youth work and youth activities, such as outdoor learning, are crucial in giving young people the relationships and skills they need for life and work as well as a place to brainstorm solutions to problems they may face. Youth workers support young people during employment and training as well as between jobs by giving them emotional support, social capital, and practical support.

Youth work helps to improve mental health

Youth work emphasizes the important role that youth workers, as trusted adults, can play in supporting young people when formal mental health support is not appropriate but when some kind and considerate listening is a critical intervention that stops problems from getting worse. It has been demonstrated that when children and adolescents have a network of close, trusting relationships with peers and trusted adults outside of their immediate family, they report fewer mental health difficulties. Several youth organizations are collaborating with local health agencies to give programs that include support for mental health and wellbeing.

In conclusion, youth involvement in the workforce and interest in it are crucial for the future.

They should search for information about both groups and ask them questions about their work and how their work influences the economy, the environment and what consequences it has on society. 3.	Presentation: After the research work, the presentation starts. Each group gets 10 minutes to present ideas, group C is required to prepare questions, and Group D is required to decide on which ideology to support and annoy the debate process. (20 min)

Debate 5.1: Two-sided discussion and debate between the group A and B5.2: Journalists turn to ask the questions and Group A and B are required to submit an answer according to the representative of the question. 5.3: Group D Finding a creative way to protest an idea that they don't support. 
